**Clerk of Courts 2014 Year in Review Released**

**April 1, 2015** – A comprehensive report of the Franklin County Clerk of Courts' 2014 work was released today to the public. For a fourth consecutive year and in keeping with the county's "green" initiatives, information is presented in electronic format at [www.cocannualreport.com](http://www.cocannualreport.com). Featured in the 2014 edition are: a video highlighting initiatives and projects completed, as well as awards received in the last year; statistics and data related to Legal and Auto Title Divisions' work; a biographical summary of the Clerk's Executive staff; and a new special statistics section devoted to data geeks in a tab labeled "SFG." Within four hours of the Year in Review release and distribution, activity on the clerk's site (<http://Clerk.FranklinCountyOhio.Gov>) noticeably increased, with pageviews specific to this annual report approaching 10% of total web traffic. "I am not surprised by the consistent level of interest our recipients show in accessing information we provide," stated County Clerk Maryellen O'Shaughnessy. Annually, Franklin County maintains the highest volume of case filings of all 88 Ohio counties.
